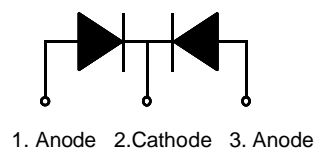
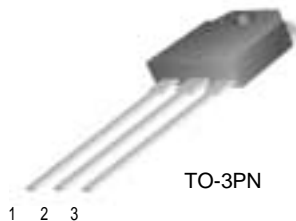

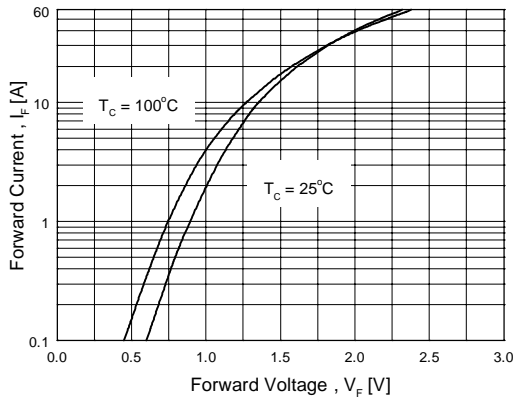


Figure 1. Typical Forward Voltage Drop vs. Forward Current

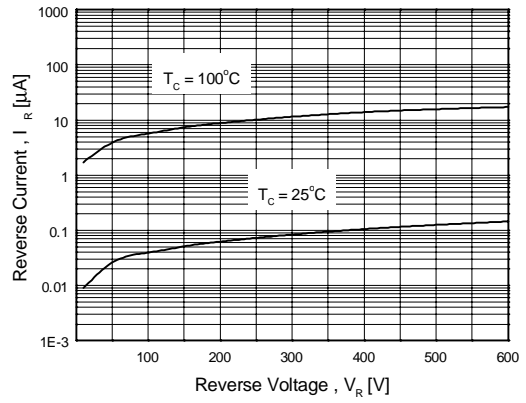


Figure 2. Typical Reverse Current vs. Reverse Voltage

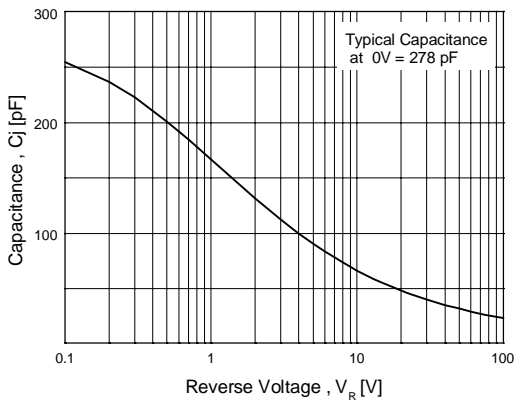


Figure 3. Typical Junction Capacitance

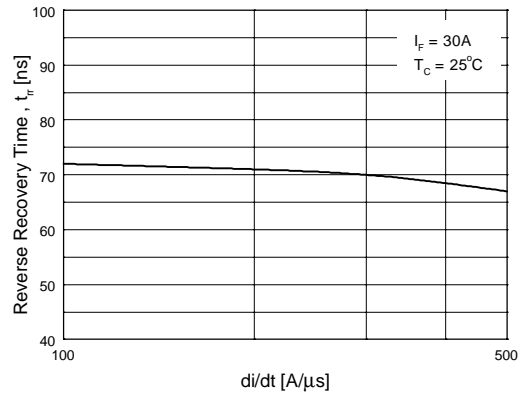


Figure 4. Typical Reverse Recovery Time vs. di/dt

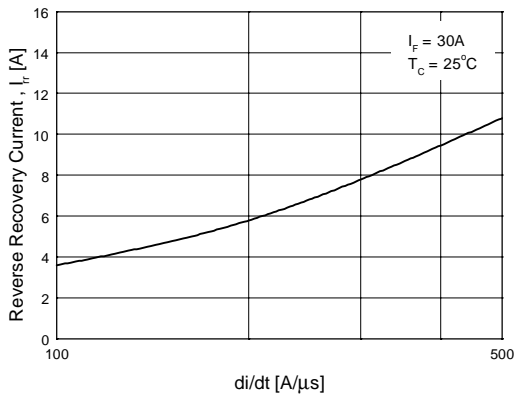


Figure 5. Typical Reverse Recovery Current vs. di/dt

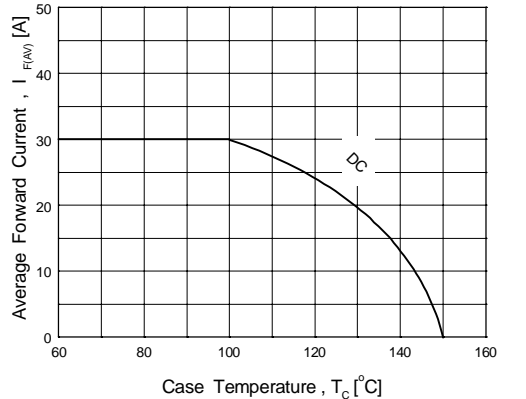
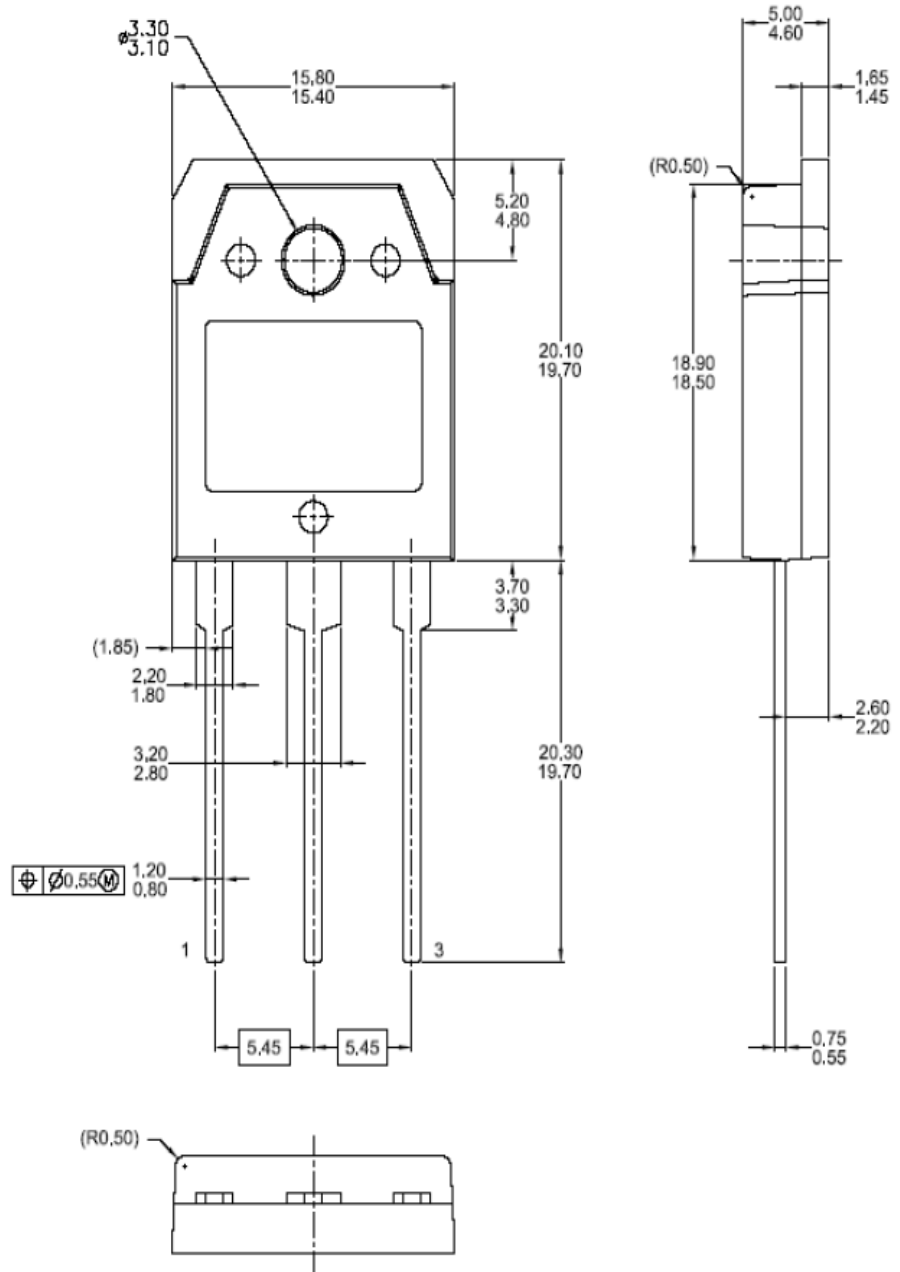


Figure 6. Forward Current Derating Curve
